

ISPS – PORT OF HANSTHOLM

Information about port security

The Port of Hanstholm is an international traffic port that meets the International Maritime Organisation's (IMO) requirements for port security (International Ship and Port Facility Security, ISPS Code).

Port security concerns everyone who works and travels at the Port of Hanstholm on a daily basis, and it is therefore in everyone's interest to keep the area safe and secure.

When the Port of Hanstholm has ships calling that are subject to ISPS regulations, they use the port's ISPS approved areas. The Port of Hanstholm has a number of quay areas that are approved for this purpose, and they will be cordoned off and marked with ISPS signage when in use. The Port of Hanstholm has two types of ISPS areas; on/off facilities and a single 24/7 facility.

The following areas are approved on/off ISPS facilities:

- Quay 12
- Quay 17
- Quay 18/81
- Quay 19/85
- Quay 23
- Quay 24

The following quay is a 24/7 facility:

- Quay 91

The Port of Hanstholm has a 24-hour port supervision service that has overall responsibility for safety in the port areas.

Should suspicious behavior from persons or foreign objects be observed in the areas or unauthorized access to the port's ISPS facilities while these are in use, the port guard must be informed.

Security levels

Control, access and monitoring of the ISPS facilities are determined by the Danish state's 3 security levels:

- **Security level 1** is the level where appropriate, minimum protection and security measures must be maintained at all times.
- **Security level 2** is the level where appropriate, additional protection and security measures must be maintained for a period due to an increased risk of a security-related incident.

- **Security level 3** is the level at which additional, specific protection and security measures must be maintained for a limited period when a security-related incident is likely or imminent, even though it may not be possible to identify the specific target.

Identification

The following are considered valid identification for entry into ISPS facilities that are in use:

- Government-issued identification card
- Personal ISPS card issued by the Port of Hanstholm
- Crew or guest card issued by the Port of Hanstholm or agent
- Personal reference, e.g. list of craftsmen
